r Black was admitted for a protocol biopsy for further assessment of his epatitis C. Prior to his biopsy he underwent an ultrasound scan and doppler, his showed mild splenomegaly but no focal lesions within the liver and normal low in the hepatic vein, the hepatic artery and portal vein. He therefore went 1 to have a liver biopsy. This showed chronic lobular and interface lymphocytic epatitis consistent with hepatitis C. The activity was thought similar to the evious biopsy, however the fibrosis has advanced and is currently 3/6. There is also moderate steatosis but this again had not changed since his previous .yago.
