REASON FOR ADMISSION -

Liver biopsy

DIAGNOSIS -

1. Liver transplant for hepatitis C - April 1996
2. Previous haemophilia
3. Recurrence of hepatitis C post transplant

CURRENT MEDICATION -

Tacrolimus 2 mg od, Ranitidine 150 mg bd, anti oxidants

FOLLOW UP -

Out patient clinic three months.


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Mr Black was admitted for a protocol biopsy for further assessment of his hepatitis C. Prior to his biopsy he underwent an ultrasound scan and doppler, this showed mild splenomegaly but no focal lesions within the liver and normal flow in the hepatic vein, the hepatic artery and portal vein. He therefore went to have a liver biopsy. This showed chronic lobular and interface lymphocytic hepatitis consistent with hepatitis C. The activity was thought similar to the previous biopsy, however the fibrosis has advanced and is currently 3/6. There is also moderate steatosis but this again had not changed since his previous biopsy.

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It was thought that there was no indication to change his current treatment on the basis of this although we may wish to discuss anti viral therapy which I understand he has declined in the past.
