Your patient was recently reviewed at the Clinic. Although he has not been troubled in the past year with any bleeding problems from his haemophiliac state he did have several other complaints. He has been experiencing occasional attacks of left-sided chest pain and although these do not appear to be ischaemic in origin, I have arranged for a cardiograph. He also complained of central abdominal pain, mainly affecting him during the night, which is relieved by milk or other food. I have therefore arranged for a barium meal. When the results of these investigations are available, I will let you know what action we propose to take.
