DIAGNOSIS;

- Hep C and alcohol induced liver failure requiring transplant 2002
- 2. Biliary leak and stricture
- 3. Recurrent hepatitis C related to cirrhosis
- 4. Decompensated hepatitis C related to cirrhosis
- 5. Re-transplant 04/02/04
- Post-op complicated by peritonitis due to leaking entero-enterostomy 12 days post transplant requiring re-fashioning of entero-enterostomy

Mr Tamburrini was admitted for investigation of his latered lvier function tests. He had a normal liver ultrasound. A liver biopsy was performed. Verbal report suggested no evidence of no obvious acute cellular rejection, and ther was no evidence of hepatitis C recurrence either. On review by Dr Bathgate, it was felt that we should treat Mr Tamburrini as likely Hep c recurrence. He was started on 90 mcg of pegulated Interferon Alpha plus 600 mg of Ribaviron daily. We also started Erythropoientin 3000 units 3 times week subcutaneously. Mr Tamburrini was given weekend leave and represented on Monday for his Hep C education by the Hep C nurse. During his stay his Tacrolimus level was noted to be markedly elevated at 21 on the 26th March 2004, as such his dose of Tarolimus was held for 2 doses and his dose of Tacrolimus reduced to 1 mg mane and 0.5 mg nocte.
