## DIAGNOSIS:

- Liver transplant for hepatitis C and alcohol related liver disease
- 2. Previous bile leak
- 3. Anastomotic biliary stricture stented at ERCP
- 4. Possible hepatic artery stenosis
- 5. Hypertension

I reviewed Mr Tambarrini in the liver transplant follow up clinic on the 12th June. He has had a bit of diarrhoea over the last couple of days and is feeling tired, but in the main is feeling better than he has previously.

Current medication -

Azathioprine 75 mg od Tacrolimus 1 mg mane - 0.5 mg nocte Atenolol 50 mg od Amlodipine 10 mg od Infrequent Paracetamol

Clinical examination revealed some mild jaundice. His chest was clear to auscultation and abdominal examination revealed the scar of his previous surgery, but was otherwise unremarkable. There was no peripheral oedema.

I will append the results of his blood tests as a PS.

I have said to Mr Tamburrini that we should review him again in 6 weeks time. I have reivewed his x-ray films with the radiologists, and although there is a couple of narrowings on hisangiogram, it is not quite certain as to the clinical significance of these. I think we will follow Mr Tamburrini's liver function tests and unless these are getting much worse would not rush to re-investigate his
