#### DIAGNOSIS;

1. Liver transplant for hepatitis C and alcohol related liver disease
2. Previous bile leak
3. Anastomotic biliary stricture - stented at ERCP
4. Possible hepatic artery stenosis
5. Hypertension

#### Current medication -

Azathioprine 75 mg od  
 Tacrolimus 0.5 mg bd  
 Atenolol 50 mg od  
 Amlodipine 10 mg od  
 Paracetamol infrequently

Results - Sodium 139, Potassium 4.3, Urea 4.9, Creatinine 83, Haemoglobin 126, WCC 4.1, Platelets 220, PTR 10 - control 9 seconds, Bilirubin 101, ALT 136, GTT 494, Alk Phos 207, Albumin 35, Glucose 4.2

I reviewed Mr Tamburrini in clinic and he reasonably well. He does complain of some fatigue and has been having loose bowel motions once or twice per day. He has noticed no blood and no change of colour in his stool. He has had no abdominal pain or vomiting. He has no symptoms suggestive of cholangitis, no fevers and no rigors.

On examination he looked well, was jaundiced but this was mild. Respiratory and cardiovascular examination were normal. Abdomen was soft and non-tender with a palpable liver edge but no ascites. Weight and BP were normal.

Unfortunately we did not have a Tacrolimus level from this clinic, and I would

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appreciate it if you could maybe take a blood sample and send the result to us. I will arrange for an MR angiogram to be performed once we have moved to the New Royal Infirmary to further clarify his arterial supply to his liver and see how this has contributed to his bilairy problems. In the meantime I would appreciate it if when you see him you could take a stool sample and send it for routine culturing.

We have made arrangements to see him here in 4 weeks time.
