Diagnosis:

1. Anastomotic biliary stricture.
2. Possible hepatic artery thrombosis.
3. Bile leak.
4. Liver transplant for hepatitis C and alcohol induced.
5. Hypertension.

This gentleman was admitted for further investigation of deranged LFTs following a recent clinic visit 27th February. Bloods at that time showed bilirubin 148, alt 191, gamma GT 404, Alk phos 374, albumin 40, Tacrolimus 8, FBC normal, urea 7, creatinine 90.

Blood tests on admission had in fact deteriorated with bilirubin 373, Alt 112, alk phos 314, albumin 37, prothrombin time 10 seconds, FBC normal.

ABDO ultrasound confirms a distended common bile duct 17cm but with no obvious debris or stones were seen. There was the suggestion also of a focal hepatic artery stenosis, possibly at the anastomosis with very turbulent flow.

He proceeded to ERCP performed on Tuesday 11th of March and this confirms stricture at the biliary anastomosis which was dilated easily and a stent was inserted at this time.

In respect to his hepatic artery flow the decision has been taken to defer this until he is seen again in clinic in 4 week's time and we would look to possible MR

angiography following the hospital's move to Little France in May of this year.
