DIAGNOSIS;

1. Bile leak
2. Liver transplant for hepatitis C and alcohol induced cirrhosis
3. Hypertension

Current medications -

Azathioprine 75 mg od
Prednisolone 5 mg od
Tacrolimus 0.5 mg mane - 1 mg nocte
Ranitidine
Cotrimoxazole
Fluconazole
Paracetamol
Tramadol
Amlodipine 10 mg od
Atenolol 50 mg od

Results - Urea 7.5, Creatinine 93, Haemoglobin 128, WCC 5.1, Platelets 207, Bilirubin 22, ALT 66, GTT 797, Alk Phos 197, Albumin 40, Tacrolimus level 13.

Follow up - 1 month liver transplant clinic.

I saw Victor in the clinic on the 28th January. He has been well with no fever or abdominal pain. I was sad to hear that his wife has recently been diagnosed with breast cancer. Victor is able to carry out normal activities and is thinking of going back to work. Unfortunately his previous occupation was working as a barman in a pool hall, and I have suggested that he should try and think of alternative employment as this could tempt him back to drinking.

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Weight was 84.6 kilos, BP had much improved at 142/85. Temp 36.7%, pulse 60.

I have asked him to stop his Prednisolone, Ranitidine, Cotrimoxazole and Fluconazole. We will arrange for him to have an ERCP on his next visit to clinic to visualise his biliary duct again.
