DIAGNOSIS:

- 1. Bile leak
- 2. Liver transplant for hepatitis C and alcohol induced cirrhosis
- 3. Hypertension

MEDICATIONS:

Prednisolone 5mg od, Tacrolimus 0.5mg bd, Ranitidine, Amlodipine 10mg od, Cotrimoxazole, Fluconazole and Tramadol

BLOOD RESULTS:

Urea 7.8, creatinine 80, FBC normal, bilirubin 29, ALT 90, gamma GT 823, alk phos 238, albumin 37, Tacrolimus 13

I saw Victor in the clinic on 14/01/03. His temperature today was 37.6, but he has not been aware of fevers or rigors at home. He feels generally well although as been a little constipated.

On examination, weight was 82.4 kilos and blood pressure was 173/111 and temperature 37.6 degrees centigrade. There was a small area of tenderness, just inferior to the scar on the left hand side, but otherwise his abdomen was normal.

We repeated his ultrasound today which now shows no evidence of a collection with
