DIAGNOSIS:

1. Bile leak
2. Liver transplant for hepatitis C and alcohol induced cirrhosis - 26.10.02

MEDICATIONS:

Azathioprine 75mg od, Prednisolone 10mg od, Tacrolimus 0.5mg mane 1mg nocte,
Ranitidine, Cotrimoxazole, Fluconazole, Forti juice, Liquigen and Paracetamol

BLOOD RESULTS:

Urea 6.0, creatinine 87, haemoglobin 116, white cells 8.2, platelets 271,
bilirubin 43, ALT 95, gamma GT 1600, alk phos 730, albumin 33, Tacrolimus level 10

I saw Victor in the clinic on 17.12.02. He remains generally well with no abdominal pain, nausea or vomiting. His bowels are normal. His drain is now down to around 40mls of bilious fluid in 24 hours. His abdomen was soft and non-tender with good wound healing.

I have asked him to reduce his Prednisolone to 5mg a day. We will see him again

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on the 24th December, and I will discuss his case with the surgeons to see if they need to bring him in for re-do of the anastomosis.
