Thank you for referring Mr Tamburrini to the Clinic. He is a 41 year old man who presented with a swelling in the right breast. He has a history of alcohol abuse and six weeks ago ceased taking Zantac. He does not give a history of anabolic steroid use. He has no other medical problems.

On examination he had an area of tenderness and thickening in the right upper outer quadrant. There was no lymphadenopathy and the nipple was actually normal. His left breast was normal. There is no testicular atrophy and there was no parotidomegaly. I feel Mr Tamburrini has atypical gynaecomastia and this was confirmed on fine needle today which showed a hypercellular aspirate with benign features. I have advised Mr Tamburrini that we should remove this considering the hypercellular nature of the fine needle. I will arrange this as soon as possible.
